Location

Located right off of Highway 29, Danville is an easy day's drive from many places on the East Coast. Plus, Amtrak trains arrive once daily at the historic train station in the heart of the River District, and Virginia Breeze busses to and from Richmond and Washington, D.C. arrive and leave daily from the downtown transportation hub. Maybe you have or want to rent an airplane? You can fly into the Danville Regional Airport!Or, just fly into one of the three major airports that are within an hour and a half drive of Danville.

## THE BEE HOTEL

The Bee Hotel was once the headquarters of the Danville Register and Bee. Vacant for many years, The Bee Hotel realized the potential of this beautiful historic building and created a 47-suite boutique hotel that capitalizes on the historic character and charm of the building.

At Mucho Taqueria, fill up on delicious tacos and a flavorful margherita. Take a to-go dessert to Ballad Brewing, who won Gold for Specialty IPA at the 2021 Virginia Craft Beer Cup Awards! Play games, or relax in the outdoor courtyard by the firepit. Before turning in for the night stop, by Golden Leaf Bistro's outdoor patio to hear live music by local talent. Or, if you like theatre, check out what plays or improv shows are happening at Smokestack Theatre Company.

# **FUN FAMILY WEEKEND**

Order a New York style pizza at Dell'anno's Pizza Kitchen, then be adventurous next door at Ma's Cakes and try a slice of "The Muddy River'', a tribute to the Dan River and the River District! A short walk along the Riverwalk Trail will bring you to The Carrington Pavilion where you can settle down on the grass to enjoy a free outdoor movie, Movies at the Crossing.

Pick up a delicious hotdog from Uncle Al's Hotdogs and more take it to Ballad Brewing, where you can play games or relax in the outdoor courtyard by the fire pit. open early at 7 a.m., so whether you are an early riser, or like to sleep in, want a specialty drink or a drip coffee; need a \$5 coffee and bagel, or a more substantial breakfast, Link's casual atmosphere and simple, delicious, and affordable menu, makes it a great place to go for breakfast.

Walk from Links to Danville's Farmers Market. The market is open from 7:30 am to 12 pm and has a variety of local vendors from meat and produce to baked goods and crafts. If you are on a budget, buy some yummy local ingredients for dinner. Sunday mornings are calm and quiet in the River District, so pick up fruit and baked goods to enjoy the next morning.

After your visit to the Farmers Market, there are a variety of things to do!

- Cross over the Dan River on the pedestrian bridge, and take a long walk along the Riverwalk Trail which has over 11 miles of paved trail that you can use to walk, run, or bike. Rent a bike through the Danville Bike Share program and cruise along the river, or head to to Anglers Park and go hiking or biking through the bluffs and small streams on the top single track mountain biking trails in Virginia.
- If you are feeling creative, sign up for an art class at Main Street Art Collective, River District Artisans, or a pottery class at Impotters Clayworx.
- If you like to relax, swing on the hammocks just outside the Farmers Market and connect with nature. Or relax in a lounge chair at the S. Union Street Pocket Park.

For lunch, Nana Karen's on Main is a yummy option.

- Browse all genres of books at The Dog-Eared Page, and even join in on a book discussion or story time.
- If you like clothes, Vintage Boutique offers fashion consultations and spectacular vintage clothing. For a personal touch and a spectacular hat, visit Angie's Hats and Boutique. Lizzy- Lou's has comfortable and modern clothing for women. Sauce VA has vintage sneakers and streetwear. Or if your style is a little more glamorous, then Glitz and Glamour is for you. If you are more into a classic style, head over to Rippe's, one of the longest running businesses on Main Street.
- Chestnut Lane Antiques, Main Street Art Collective, Commonwealth Silver and Goldsmiths, and River District Artisans are great for purchasing gifts or art.

If history interests you more than shopping, the River District has several options for walking tours.

- Book an engaging tour with Our History Matters for an in depth and inspiring look at Danville's Civil Rights history and Black business district. Some of the most prominent Civil Rights leaders visited Danville, including Martin Luther King, Jr..
- Head over to the Danville Historical Society, to learn more about Danville's long history as one of the largest tobacco auctions in the country, as well as it's history as one of the largest textile mill towns in the country.
- If you don't have the budget to book an in person tour, the River District App: Distrx, has three amazing self guided audio tours: The Civil Rights Tour, The Downtown Revitalization Tour, and the Arts and Sculpture Tour.

For a bit of a rest while shopping or touring stop by Vintages by the Dan between 12-5 for personalized advice on the best beer or wine for your dinner, and free tastings. Or, get a frozen yogurt treat at Di'lishi Danville to eat at the Fountain on Main Street Plaza before taking an afternoon break.

# BREAKFAST

Take your newspaper, or your book from The Dog-Eared Page to S. Union Street Pocket Park to relax and eat the breakfast goodies you bought Saturday at the Farmers Market. The Park is built on the site of a building constructed sometime between 1877 and 1885 for the New & Miller Carriage Company during a time when streets in Danville were filled with horses, wagons, and carriages. When in the park, visitors are standing in the former stable, where horses bringing tobacco to auction would rest while their owners conducted business.
